## City of Marshall, Michigan receives the BASF 'Project Habitat Award':

The Calhoun Conservation District in southern Michigan has long been a local leader for conservation assistance. Such was the case when they were approached by a local volunteer group hoping to restore a City-owned farm that had been set aside to serve as a community park. Like most small towns, "the City simply did not have the resources or expertise to move forward" noted Dave Phaner, a local resident who formed the volunteer group. Gregg Strand, who worked for the Conservation District at the time, developed the initial conservation plan and proposed several funding opportunities to the volunteer group for establishing native grasses, including USDA and the US Fish & Wildlife Service. Tom Eitniewski, Partners Program biologist with the USFWS, immediately offered support for the project. Strand noted "Once we had explored these opportunities and identified funding to help with this project, the next step was to include a professional installation company." Strand added "With a public park that would attract a lot of local resident attention, I knew that the project could not wait 3-5 years for typical results or risk a failed planting. After consultation, FDC Enterprises was the obvious choice". Eitniewski offered, "Projects like these are great opportunities for USFWS to forge new partnerships. Having worked with FDC Enterprises as well as the Conservation District on previous restorations, I knew all of the pieces were in place for a very successful project." The City, working with USDA, then enrolled the 88 acres into CRP, securing the additional funding it would take to establish and maintain this public resource.

Using precision custom drills and herbicide equipment, along with the expertise of STAR Seed to provide the best seed varieties for this site, FDCE converted the City-owned farm into a diverse habitat of native grasses. By the end of the first growing season, grasses had fully established with seed heads over 6 feet. Dwayne Cowgill, Marshall's Mayor, says that "without the breadth of partner support, along with the success of the restoration, our community would never have had this unique resource for our citizens to enjoy."

With help from FDC Enterprises, the City of Marshall submitted an application for and received the coveted BASF 'Project Habitat Award'. This honor goes to local groups and/or companies who exhibit exceptional environmental responsibility in local restoration efforts. FDC Enterprises is a QVM (Quality Vegetation Management) Certified company, one of 48 companies worldwide awarded this special status and is the only native grass installation company in this elite group. Aside from environmental responsibility, the award spotlights projects that exhibit strong partner support. This project had all of these requirements.
